The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent, and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Albert Granger of the City, County and State of New York, have invented a new design for a Steel Pen; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of said design.

The new feature as compared with any other steel pen now manufactured, is the impression (on that part known to pen manufacturers as the "heel" of the pen, as shown at letter A, in the accompanying drawing) of a medallion bearing a likeness of Washington, in basso relievo F.

Hence the appellation - "Washington Medallion Pen". The middle third part of the pen (B) is in form depressed, from the top of the hole in the "nib" (C) to the base of the "Washington Medallion". This depression is divided in the centre by a ridge (D) raised gradually from either side.

The sides of the depressed middle of the pen (B) are cut out in a concave form (E.)

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by letters patent, is the device impressed on the pen, namely, a medallion bearing a likeness of Washington.
